JUNIOR FOOTBALL

500+ PLAYERS







Redditch United boast a large junior section with activities for children from 3 years of age and competitive teams from U7's. As a club we have over 500 registered players providing a pathway to Men's and Women's first team football. Our teams compete in a variety of Leagues providing an inclusive and competitive environment for all abilities.

At the base of our pyramid are our foundation sessions that provide in introduction to the game for 5-12 years old and these sessions are delivered at our stadium by FA licenced coaches. Players from these sessions are provided opportunities to continue their footballing journey through the variety of team at the football club.



At Redditch United we love nothing more than opening up the doors to our stadium for the benefit of other local teams. Each season Redditch United host a variety of one day Tournaments for junior teams across the local area including two days at Christmas 2022 where the stadium hosted football for over 500 local players in age group tournaments from U7-U16.

Redditch United are also the proud hosts of a number of school cups and league cup finals.

EDUCATION

Redditch United have a proud history of delivering education at the stadium. In 2021 the club invested in a new education centre that currently houses full time college level education for over 60 learners. We are again looking to invest in other facilities this summer and aim to broaden the curriculum offer to other subject areas.

Our post-16 Football & Education programme that has been running at the club since 2009. This programme offers school and college leavers the opportunity to take part in their education alongside a competitive football programme and have their futures enhanced by a variety of additional qualifications and employability experiences.

SEND EDUCATION

Redditch United partner with Heart of Birmingham Vocational College (HBVC) to deliver what is believed to be the countries only full-time SEND sports programme delivered at a football club.

HBVC are an independent specialist college for learners aged between 16 and 25 with special educational needs and/or autism. The programme enables learners to gain experience and new skills to help them become more independent and employment ready. These learners will learn through realistic, practical, handson activities that will increase their confidence and employability.

Learners form HBVC take part in a Sport and Education programme at Redditch United with the club also being the home for the colleges pan disability team who train and play their fixtures at the stadium.

This year Redditch United will host the Birmingham County FA's inaugural pandisability education league festival. The event, the first of its kind in the midlands, is an all-inclusive event that will act as the centrepiece for the County's new Pan-Ability football division.





SCHOOLS DELIVERY

Redditch United currently support a variety of local schools with curriculum and enrichment delivery. Our coaches provide both football and multi-sport activity sessions.

HOLIDAY CAMPS

Redditch United open their doors for school holiday camps keeping young people active though these periods. After Covid Holiday and Food (HaF) funding was used to provide free activity sessions with a healthy meal to local school children who are registered for free school meals. Due to the success of this programme Redditch Borough Council have provided additional funding to provide more places and in 2023 the provision is being expanded to provide activity sessions in arts and crafts and gaming.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Redditch United work with a range of external partners to provide additional health and wellbeing opportunities to a diverse community.



Redditch is the base for the England Walking Football Community and host their monthly training session for mends and women's teams from over 50's to over 60's. These teams take part in a range of competitions across the world. In September 2022 Redditch United hosted a Nations International Tournament with teams travelling to Redditch from Ireland, Isle of Man, Wales and Peru.



MAN v FAT is for men who want to lose weight. The organisation run one of their award-winning weight loss programmes at the stadium providing guidance, resources and community men from across the local area.



Redditch United were recently awarded funding to provide weekly Walking Football sessions for local people who are living with Parkinson's. The sessions will be delivered at the stadium and will begin this summer.

The sessions will be tailored for people living with Parkinson's, allowing for the development of movement with a football and specialist skill sessions to support coordination and movement.

EMPLOYABILITY

We are passionate about offering young people opportunities to learn and gain relevant industry experiences. We will continue to do this by investing resources into creating apprenticeships, work placements and continuous professional development for all contracted staff. This level of commitment will help us to deliver high quality, safe learning environments within all our programs. Our aim is to create employment opportunities where there are realistic opportunities to progress careers within the football club.



The Government Kickstart Scheme was launched during Covid to provide young people additional employment opportunities. The aim of the programme was to enable young people aged 16-24 to build their skills in a real workplace and help them find work in a tough post-lockdown jobs market. As part of this scheme Redditch United were able to offer 17 places to young people. Once their placement was over, they would have a better chance of finding long-term work thanks to their new-found job experience. At the end of the placements, Redditch United were able to provide continued paid employment to 7 employees with two joining the club as full-time employees.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Redditch United are also a hub of work experience placements for local students across a variety of levels of education. The football club have been able to provide placements in sports therapy, coaching, marketing and event management.

CHARITY



Redditch United work with a range of charities each year and use the club's facilities to help them promote their cause and raise vital funds. Each season the club nominates a local charity to champion and deliver a range of activities to spotlight the season chosen charity. In 2021, the club started working with Libby Mae's Little Angels and made the decision to create a custom pink kit for the club's team to play in with the profits from the kit going directly to the charity.







With the use of our 1891 Lounge, we've been able to host many charity events which have raised thousands of pounds for fantastic causes.

With a room that can host over 100 people that encompasses a stage, dancefloor, projector, multiple TVs, a PA system, fully stocked bar, catering facilities and even two extra rooms, Redditch United is the perfect venue for fundraising.
